1) Transportation:

I. Bus

[Oxford Bus System](#)- The bus system is a great way to get easily around town and to and from the city centre. We'd recommend getting a key card and buying the multiple journey option. The [OxfordTube](#) leaves from Oxford every 10 minutes headed to London. The [OxfordHeathrowGatwick](#) bus is also the best way to get to and from the airport-just make sure to buy a return ticket, as it will save you loads of money.

II. Bike

Biking is the quickest way to get around town without a car. You can get great deals for bikes on [gumtree](#) or [daily info](#).

III. Cab

Cabs can get pricey but we recommend: [001 Taxi](#). They have the best rates bottom line and send text updates on their arrivals.

II. Utilities – If you're living in college housing, then your college will direct you on setting up utilities; if you're living privately, the landlord or letting agency will direct you on setting up utilities, more than likely the following: [Thames Water](#), [Scottish & Southern](#), [BT Gas & Electric](#). Word of caution for those living privately: Shop around, and get a rate locked in, as they're always raising prices. There are several companies that are sort of the 'middle men,' charging higher prices than dealing directly with the gas/electric companies; avoid using them, if possible.

12) **Health-Drs., etc**

I. *Doctors* –

You'll need to register with a Dr's office upon arrival into the UK. Most of the time, this is done through your college. If not, go [here](#) for the NHS website.

II. *Dentists* –

The NHS website also provides dentists for the Oxford area. However, it may take several calls to various offices to find out if they're

accepting new patients. You can also go to a private dentist, although it will be more expensive.
